Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults

“It is a gradual process that takes place within the larger parish community”

It is an ongoing four-step process, designed to welcome new members, those who have not yet been baptized and those baptized in another faith, into the Catholic Church. At the same time it helps lead every Catholic to a deeper belief and renewal of faith.



Who could join RCIA?

- Any adult or youth who has been baptized in another faith tradition, and wishes to embrace the Catholic faith fully.
- Any adult or youth who has not been baptized in any faith tradition, and wants to become a Catholic.
