addition In to your generous donations to our Wine & Onsies, **Thanksgiving & Wheelchair Drives** and Angel Tree Project, our Parish Outreach Fund enabled us to help coordinate emergency housing for a parishioner who was facing eviction, a family maintain their help employment by facilitating the purchase of used tires for their vehicle, and help a person with travel funds to pick up his grandchildren after his daughter passed away in a car accident out of state. We also provided a Christmas Party & Gifts for the residents of the San Antonio North Nursing Home.

We hosted & funded 3 ACTS Retreats, 2 Marriage Preparation Retreats, 1 World Marriage Day Retreat & 1 Ministry Leader Retreat. We also offered no cost space use to Foster Grandparents, Adopt-a-Senior, CYO, Ministry of the Third Cross, MAAC & St. Anthony High & Elem. Schools for Retreats, Outreach & Sports. We walked side by side in the faith journeys of 208 Religious Education students & 12 RCIA Catechumen. We administered the Sacraments of First Communion to 55 children & 10 Adults, Confirmation to 35 Students & 12 Adults. We celebrated 11 marriages and baptized 24 infants & 7 adults.

We were able to complete some major property projects including an overhaul of our plumbing/water system, an upgrade to our church sound system and begin our security upgrades to the church & property.

Through the donation of time, labor and technical skills of staff members Deacon George Wunderlich & Kevin Mehl, our Baptismal Font and some Sacred Vessels have been serviced and polished and our parish sign has been repurposed & restored to its former place in front of our church.

While this is in no way a complete record of all of the many ways our parish walked in the path of Our Lord Jesus and worked to fulfill His mission for us, it is a small reflection of how Our Lady of Grace Parish & its parishioners truly are A Faithful & Caring Catholic Community! Love Your

Today we honor family life in general by pausing to ponder the particular and beautiful hidden life within the home of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. In many ways, their daily life together would have been very similar to other families at that time. But in other ways, their life together is entirely unique and provides us with a perfect model for all families. By God's providence and design, the family life of Jesus, Mary and Joseph was spoken of in the Scripture very little. We read of the birth of Jesus, the presentation in the Temple, the flight into Egypt and the finding of Jesus in the Temple at age twelve. But other than these stories of their life together, we know very little. The line from today's Gospel quoted above does, however, give us some insight worth pondering. First, we see that this family "fulfilled all the prescriptions of the law of the Lord..." Though this is in reference to Jesus being presented in the Temple, it should also be understood to apply to all aspects of their life together. Family life, just like our individual lives, must be ordered by the laws of our Lord. The primary law of the Lord regarding family life is that it must share in the very unity and "communion of love" found in the life of the Most Holy Trinity. Each person of the Holy Trinity has perfect respect for the other, gives selflessly to each other without reserve, and receives each person in their totality. It is their love that makes them one and enables them to act together in perfect harmony as a communion of divine Persons. Though Saint Joseph was not immaculate in his nature, the perfection of love did live in his divine Son and in his immaculate wife. This overwhelming gift of their perfect love would have daily drawn him into the perfection of their lives. Ponder your own closest relationships today. If you are blessed with a close family, ponder them. If not, ponder the persons put into your life who you are called to love with familial love. Who are you to be there for in good times and in bad? Who are you to sacrifice your life for without reserve? Who are you to offer respect, compassion, time, energy, mercy, generosity and every other virtue? And how well do you fulfill this duty of love?

Reflect, today, upon the fact that God wants you to share in a communion of life, not only with the Most Holy Trinity but also with those around you, especially your family. Try to ponder the hidden life of Jesus, Mary and Joseph and seek to make their family relationship the model for how you love others. May their perfect communion of love be a model for us all.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament



"Your sufferings, accepted and borne with unshakeable faith, when joined to those of Christ take on extraordinary value for the life of the Church and the good of humanity". (Message of the Holy Father Pope John Paul II for the First Annual World Day of the Sick, 5)

As the mother of Christ, one of Mary's many titles is "Our Lady of Sorrows". Fittingly, the name "Mary" has roots in the Hebrew word "marah" meaning "bitterness". Commonly depicted in art with a sword piercing her heart, Monday's Gospel introduces us to the first of Mary's Seven Sorrows: "And you yourself a sword will pierce". The Holy Family went through many trials together, but Mary, in particular, endured steadfast in her fiath and never once wavered in her devotion to God although she was exposed to so many trials.

Saint John Paul II declared: "[T]he Blessed Virgin advanced in her pilgrimage of faith, and faithfully persevered in her union with her Son unto the cross... uniting herself with a maternal heart with His sacrifice" (Lumen Gentium, 58). In her apparitions as Our Lady of Kibeho in the 1980's in Rwanda, Mary asked that we pray the Chaplet of the Seven Sorrows for repentance, and also noted that we must "bear our sufferings every day" if we want to be with Christ in Heaven. If we imitate Mary's faith, we too will survive whatever wounds this hard world inflicts on us and one day rejoice with God's Holy Family. What suffering in your life is God using for His glory?
