Introducing Our newest Mission Work in Pedro Carbo, Guayaquil, Ecuador

When the sisters first met the people in the area and experienced their warmth and welcome their hearts burned with the desire to "stay" with them. The area of Pedro Carbo is very poor. There are a large number of children who are physically and mentally challenged in need of education and training and the sisters were happy to take over this very special work. The clinic was originally started because many of the mothers were dying at childbirth. Now it has grown and there are more departments in the clinic to help individuals with other health problems. The clinic provides services to all in the area and the patients at Clinica de Nuestra Senora de Mercidad are treated with dignity and respect.


There is so much to do and so much help needed! These sisters can do the work only if you can help them with your prayers and donations! It is a joy and a blessing to be able to share what we have with others in need! The five sisters who are in Ecuador find many challenges: adjusting to hot weather, learning a new language and culture, experiencing different food, seeing poverty and learning the new work, but with your prayers and concern they will be blessed with God's grace and continue to see the beauty in these differences. The parable in today's the Gospel has a crooked steward who is commended by his master for being prudent, or clever, trying to protect himself. Jesus wanted us to be just as clever in serving the Lord. Let's look at the first two readings and how they challenge us to do more.

The reading from Amos talks about those "who trample upon the needy and destroy the poor" (Amos 8:4). The challenge here is to ask yourself, "What do I do for the poor?" Most parishes have organizations to help the needy and are happy to get volunteers. Do you ever think of praying for the poor?

Speaking of prayer, our second reading also challenges us to do more. Paul recommends prayers for "kings and for all in authority" (1 Timothy 2:2). It's easy to pray for friends and family; how much time do we give to prayers for government leaders and executives? Paul reminds us that God wants everyone to be saved (1 Timothy 2:4), sinners as well as saints, terrorists and embezzlers, atheists and agnostics. I'll bet you don't spend much time praying for the "bad guys." Yet Jesus said, "Love your enemies. Pray for those who hurt you" (Matthew 5:44). I can't say I've ever heard anyone say that was their favorite Bible passage. But if Jesus expects more from those who love him, who are we to let him down?






